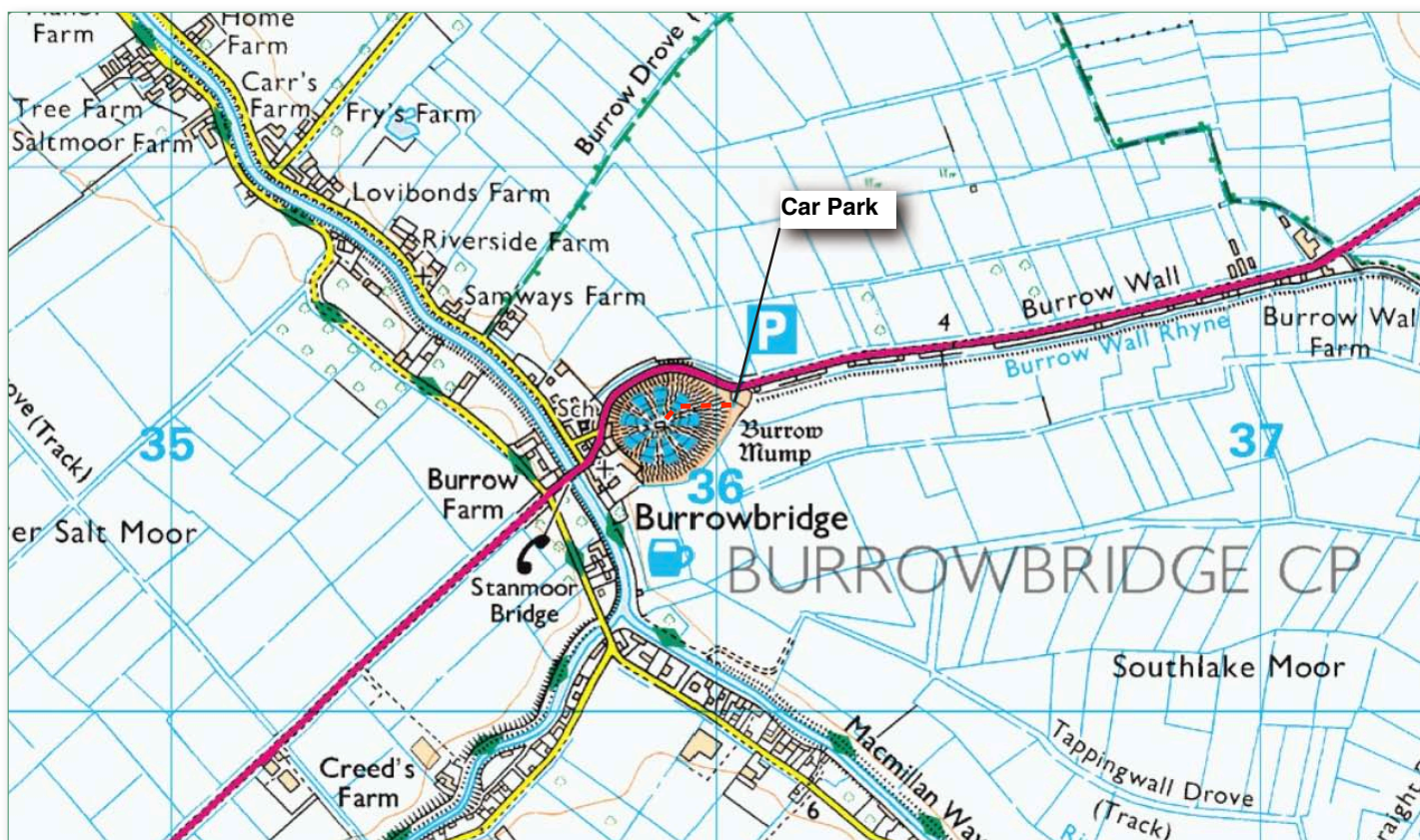

Small but beautiful!

A wonderful location for a picnic with just a short walk to the top of the hill grazed by sheep. The Church ruins on the top – dedicated to St Michael – was itself built on the ruins of an earlier Medieval church. It is now a war memorial dedicated to the men and women of Somerset who gave their lives in the first and second world wars.

The views from the top are especially spectacular in winter when the Mump seems like an island rising out of the flooded levels and the 'inland sea' of South Lake Moor.



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HOW TO GET THERE

By bus: Taunton to Wells

By car: A361 5 miles SE of Bridgwater.

Walk route: Just 130 metres and approximately 5 minutes!

The summit and the ruined 18th-century church is easily reached by a short and steep climb from the car park.

Start/end: At Burrowbridge, 2½ miles SW of Othery. **Grid ref:** ST ST359305

Facilities: National Trust car park (free) – no toilets. King Alfred Inn nearby.

Directions: Go through a gate from the car park and take a short and steep walk up a grassy slope.
