

# Visit Somerset's 360°s

## Lollover Hill

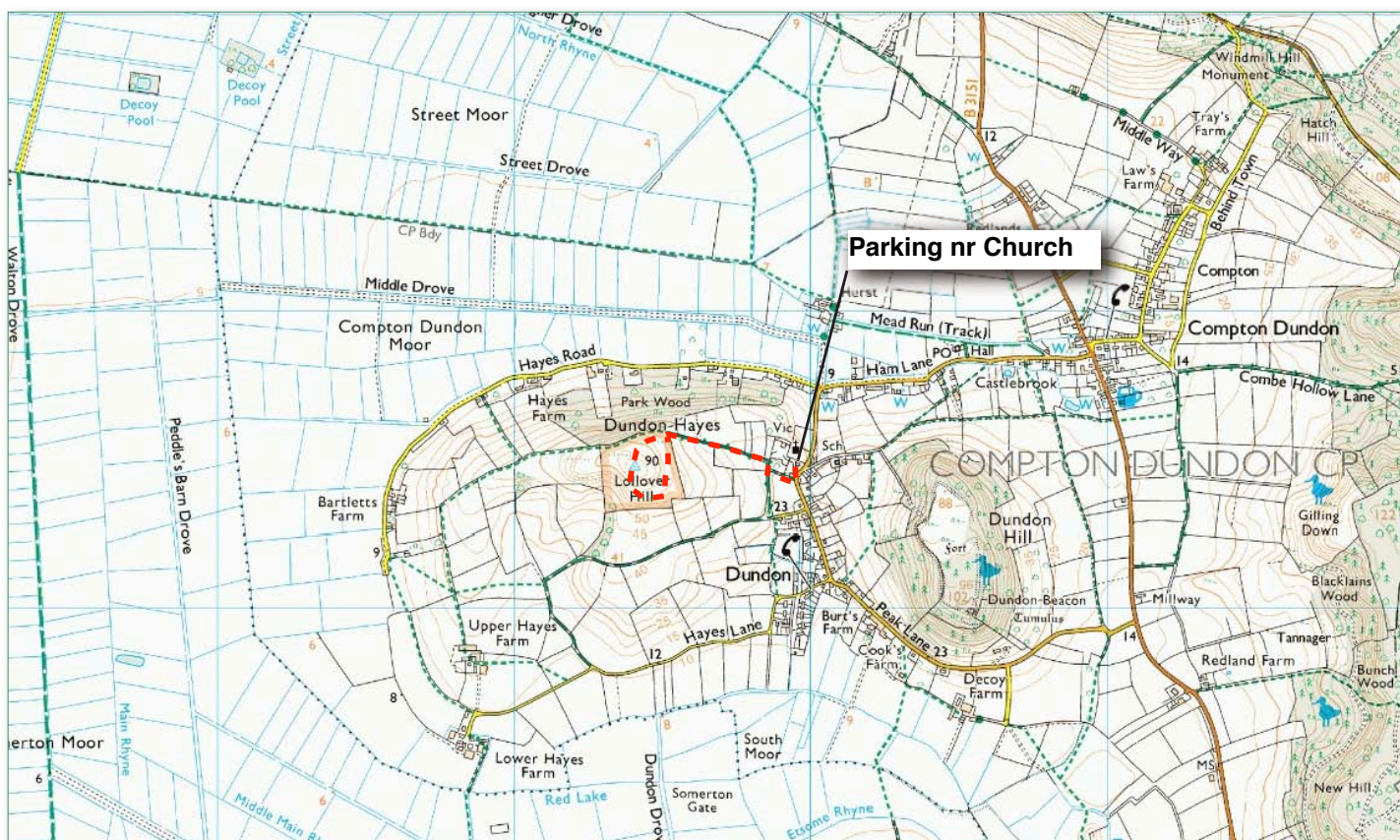

### ***A lovely quiet spot off the beaten track!***

Stunning views across the Somerset Levels. Nearby are Dundon Hill and the Polden Hills ridge, beyond which you can see the Mendip Hills. Other landmarks in view are Glastonbury Tor and Hinkley Point Power Station on the coast. The stone column you can see on Windmill Hill is the Admiral Hood Monument. Samuel Hood (1724-1814) was one of England's most famous admirals serving in the Napoleonic War.

Some say Lollover comes from 'Look Over' referring to the fact that locals went up the hill to watch the 1685 Battle of Sedgemoor.

## HOW TO GET THERE

**By bus:** Wells – Compton Dundon – Ilchester

**By car:** South of Street signposted Somerton on B3151

**Walk route:** 1 mile – 40 mins

Gentle walk from village along footpath and bridleways that lead to a gate into field that is Lollover Hill. Sheep graze this Open Access site so please keep dogs on leads.

**Start/end:** Footpath near village Compton Dundon church **Grid ref:** ST 474324

**Facilities:** Car parking at church or nearby lanes – please park considerately.

**Directions:** Take signposted footpath near village church and cross over a small wooden bridge on to wider track. Turn right and follow up hill to gate. Pass through gate and bear right for short distance before heading up hill to the summit.

You can walk down the hill the other side, following a path that will bring you back round to the gate to then return to the start point.
