Exmoor

Much of the Exmoor area is designated as a National Park that extends for nearly 270 square miles. Huge stretches are owned by the National Trust or protected as Nature Reserves and Heritage Coast, so there is a four-fold guarantee that these landscapes and seascapes are of a truly exceptional quality.

On the open moorland of Dunkery Hill if you look towards the coast a sea of purple heather rolls down into the lush green farmlands that fringe the coast. All of Exmoor's ingredients come together in this one glorious scene – a spectacular coastline, ancient oak woods and the heather moorland, it's this amazing scenic variety that sets Exmoor apart.

Snowdrops

There is no hard proof that snowdrops are native to Britain. Generally they do not thrive well in northern Europe and it is thought that they were brought to Britain from southern Europe by Benedictine monks in the 11th century because of their religious symbolism. They certainly seem to thrive around monastic sites.

Mildness of climate seems to be a requirement for snowdrops, despite their association with snow. They also like damp conditions and are often found near rivers. On Exmoor their main means of spreading is by floodwaters. Snowdrops need pollinating insects to form seed, but flower when there are few such insects therefore the flowers have to be extra attractive to the overwintering insects that are around.

Dunster

Dunster was a purely agricultural settlement in Domesday times. It developed under its Norman owners, the de Mohuns, who established a borough in the late 13th century. When the Luttrell family became Lords of the Manor. they helped develop Dunster as a market centre, harbour and clothmanufacturing centre. Its heyday was in the 14th century. By the 15th century the harbour was replaced by Minehead. The cloth industry finally died out in the 18th century. The Luttrells remained in the Castle until 1975 when they passed it over to the National Trust.

The Castle is usually open in January and February on a guided tour basis
