Taunton is a bustling, forward-looking town with excellent amenities and good road and rail links to the rest of the country, making it a great place to visit as well as to live. A varied and eclectic cultural offer and range of events provide something for everyone to look forward to throughout the year.

Taunton gained importance in Saxon times when a fort was established on the banks of the River Tone giving rise to the town's name, Tone Tun – settlement on the Tone. It has witnessed turbulent times during the Civil War and been at the forefront of development as the first town in the country to have permanent electric street lighting.

There is a wealth of history to discover, one of the jewels in the town centre is the Somerset County

Museum, housed within the impressive Taunton Castle, it is ever-popular with locals and a must for visitors.

Nestled in the Vale of Taunton Deane, Taunton is surrounded by picturesque countryside. The glorious Quantock Hills rise to the west with their atmospheric combes and windswept heathland and to the south, the striking Blackdown Hills are draped in ancient woodlands. These designated Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, and proximity to the Somerset Levels, make Taunton an ideal location to enjoy fabulous walks and scenery and get close to nature.

A good selection of independent shops as well as familiar high street names, distinctive restaurants and cafes and great attractions, as well as pretty riverside walks and parks, all combine to make Taunton a wonderful destination.

SHOPPING

There are ample opportunities for retail therapy in Taunton and the town is proud to offer a wide range of independent stores, many of which have been established in the town for decades with a loyal following and reputation for excellent customer service and quality.

Bath Place with its rich history, and the Taunton Independent Quarter by the river, present a diverse mix of shops, from chic boutiques and quirky games and gift shops to specialist wine and food retailers.

Well-known high street brands can be found in the Orchard Centre and main shopping streets and, with many areas pedestrianised and plenty of delightful eateries, shopping in Taunton is a relaxed affair.

As befits a traditional market town, Taunton holds a Farmers' Market every Thursday providing an outlet for exceptional producers to sell their wares. From orchards and farms, butchers, bakers and cheese makers bring a bustle to the High Street and the opportunity to savour some of the best local produce.

Taunton Independent Market (www.tauntonmarket.co.uk) takes place once a month on Castle Green. It is a showcase for some of the best food producers and artisans in the region. With an emphasis on shopping local, it is a very popular event that brings a vibrancy to the town.

For antique hunters and collectors, the Taunton Antiques Market, held on Mondays on Silver Street, hosts over 100 dealers selling all manner of treasures.

On the outskirts of the town, the Riverside, Hankridge and Priory Fields retail parks are where you will find well-known carpet and furniture retailers, builders' merchants, DIY stores and home furnishing retailers.

You don't have to travel far from the town to find farm shops selling great local produce as well as traditional, award-winning cider makers and breweries. A number of excellent garden centres and plant nurseries are also within easy reach.











FOOD AND DRINK

Being in the heart of Somerset, a county well known for its agricultural tradition, Taunton has a strong connection with the outstanding produce for which the area is recognised. Many of the eating establishments in the town serve food grown, reared or made in the area keeping food miles low and quality of produce high.


